

Spotlight on Safety

LADDER SAFETY

1 Position the ladder properly

Fully open the stepladder on a level surface and lock its spreaders in place.

Never use a stepladder folded up and leaning against a surface.

2 Use a ladder that is long enough

Never climb on the top two steps of a stepladder.

Never place the stepladder on boxes or unstable bases to gain extra height.



3 Climb and use the ladder carefully

Maintain 3-point contact with the ladder while climbing (such as 1 hand and 2 feet).

Brace yourself with your free hand, if possible.

Always face the stepladder treads while using a stepladder.

Never overreach or lean to one side while using a stepladder.

Never carry heavy, bulky, or other objects that may make going up or down a ladder

- Wear clean slip-resistant shoes. Shoes with leather soles are not appropriate for ladder use since they are not considered sufficiently slip-resistant.
- Before using a ladder, inspect it to confirm it is in good working condition.
- Ladders with loose or missing parts must be rejected.
- Rickety ladders that sway or lean to the side must be rejected.
- The ladder you select must be the right size for the job
- The Duty Rating of the ladder must be greater than the total weight of the climber, tools, supplies, and other objects placed upon the ladder.

- The length of the ladder must be sufficient so that the climber does not have to stand on the top rung or step.
- Only one person at a time is permitted on a ladder unless the ladder is specifically designed for more than one climber (such as a Trestle Ladder).
- Ladders must not be placed in front of closed doors that can open toward the ladder. The door must be blocked open, locked, or guarded.
- Read the safety information labels on the ladder.


