Winter Weather Safety

The winter season is upon us! During this time of year, the weather can pose many safety risks, both at home & in the workplace.

Be Prepared: Stay informed by watching the local weather. Know what type of environmental conditions to expect like "freezing rain, sleet, snow, ice or below freezing temps"!



Safety Tip:

Get severe weather alerts on your cell phone from the weather channel.



Watch Wet Floors: Unfortunately, the outdoors does not always stay outside. Pay extra attention to entrances & high traffic areas in your building during the winter months. Patrons will bring snow, ice and even the salt in on their shoes which creates puddles, wet & slick floors. This can be dangerous.

Avoiding Illness: Cold weather is also a time for common illnesses such

as the common cold and influenza. To safeguard against these airborne pathogens, there are a few

Winter Driving Safety Whether you drive a company vehicle or not, please keep in mind that winter weather causes many unsafe driving conditions. Allow extra time to get to and from work. Icy or snow covered roads & impaired visibility from blowing snow will affect the speed you can go. Drive defensively so you can avoid an accident when another driver loses control.



Ice/Snow on Walkways: Ice and snow on sidewalks & walkways is common during the winter months. To avoid slipping on ice, sprinkle ice melt/salt (provided at every account) on sidewalks &/or any path you commonly take to & from your car and near the dumpsters. *If your account does not have ice melt - let your manager know asap!

ESS provides personal protective equipment on request at no cost to the employee. If you need a pair of ice cleats for hauling wastes to the dumpster, contact the office, 217-337-6701.

Dressing for the Cold

It is especially important to dress for weather conditions during the winter months. For maximum protection and com-

fortability, both indoors and out; dress in layers. For outerwear, select a high quality coat that has a nylon outer layer to break the wind and a wool or synthetic inner layer to provide insulation. In addition to a coat, invest in a hat, gloves and boots.

Don't Gamble with Slips, Trips and Falls Stand up for Safety

- Keep floors and stairs clean and clear of equipment and materials.
- Maintain good lighting both indoors and out
- Secure electrical and phone cords out of traffic areas
- Use nonskid throw rugs in potentially slippery places like bath rooms
- Always put out "Caution: Wet Floor" signs when mopping floors
- Arrange furniture to provide open pathways to walk through
- Periodically check the condition of outdoor walkways and steps and repair as necessary
- Install handrails on stairways, including porches
- Clean all spills immediately
- Remove fallen leaves or snow from outdoor walkways
- Never stand on a chair, table or surface on wheels

- Be aware that alcohol or other drugs, including prescription and over-the- counter medications, can affect your balance and increase risk of falling
- When not in use, tools and other equipment should be kept in proper storage places—if you need to leave your barrel, cart, or mop bucket temporarily, put it against a wall. Do not leave it in a blind corner, as someone could come around the corner, not see the equipment, and trip over it.
- Never leave mop handle sticking out of a mop bucket away from the wall where someone could walk into it and get hurt; lean it against the wall.
- In icy conditions, spread ice melt and wear ice cleats (available to all team members) when walking on ice.
 When walkways freeze, walk safely please.
- Use a sturdy step stool when climbing or reaching for high places
- Wear sensible footwear


