Best Practices to Prevent Workplace Accidents

- Don't take short cuts. Stick to the instructions and work with diligence and awareness of your surroundings.
- Be diligent about maintenance. Make sure that your work closets aren't cluttered and unkempt. Make sure you are checking electrical cords and doing your regular cleaning on your backpack vacuums.
- Be Ready for any Weather. With warmer temperatures coming make sure you are drinking plenty of fluids and wearing loose fitting comfortable clothing.
- 4. Wear the correct PPE (personal protective equipment) when

required.

- Do not lift by bending forward. Bend your hips and knees to squat down to your load, keep it close to your body, and straighten your legs to lift. Avoid turning or twisting your body while lifting and raising trash into the dumpster.
- 6. Always test weight of trash before lifting it.
 NEVER try to toss the trash in the dumpster
 while holding the lid open. 1)Always place the
 bag on the ground near the bin; 2) Open the lid
 3) Pick up the bag with both hands. Never
 throw or toss objects into the dumpsters. Remember NEVER compact trash with hand use
 smaller trash can.

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

Personal protective equipment (PPE) refers to any type of clothing or equipment designed to increase personal safety by protecting you from workplace injuries or illnesses, e.g., goggles, gloves, and earplugs. To greatly reduce your exposure to a potentially harmful chemical or activity, use the PPE provided by ESS Clean.

Disposable Gloves:

Disposable vinyl or nitrile gloves are provided to all employees. Again, employees are not required to wear gloves for the entirety of their shift but there are a few tasks that require them.

- ♦ You are required to wear gloves when cleaning restrooms.
- ♦ You are also required to change your gloves when you come out of the restroom to prevent cross-contamination.
- ♦ At medical facilities, you are required to wear them when handling biohazard wastes and when cleaning in treatment and exam rooms. In addition to these situations, some employees (especially those with sensitive skin) may wish to wear gloves when using our stronger cleaning chemicals like disinfectant.





Safety glasses are available at all job sites. Employees are not required to wear safety glasses during their entire shift, but there are a few tasks that require them so they should be readily available at all job sites. If you are using the acid toilet bowl cleaner, you are required to wear safety glasses. This chemical causes blindness within eight seconds if it is accidently splashed into your eyes, so preventing the possibility is key. Also wear safety glasses when

- **♦** Changing light bulbs.
- **♦** Dusting ceiling vents
- ♦ Manually diluting any chemical with water

Anti-Vibration Gloves:

Employees who operate heavy floor equipment such as buffers, scrubbers or carpet machines are required to wear anti-vibration gloves while operating this equipment. Anti-vibration gloves are designed to dampen the vibration of the machine and reduce the risk of carpal tunnel.





Snow Cleats:

Employees whose trash container is a long distance away from the building may need to wear snow cleats to help increase traction allowing them to walk safety in snow and ice keeping them safe from slips and falls.

WHAT IS AN SDS?

Safety Data Sheets (SDSs) are summary documents, usually written by the manufacturer, that

provide information about the hazards of a product and advice about safety precautions. SDSs provide more detailed hazard information about the product than the label. Use this information to identify the hazards of the products you use and to protect yourself from those hazards, including safe handling and emergency measures formerly known as Material Safety Data Sheets (or MSDS), SDSs use a consistent, user-friendly format.

- Sections 1 through 8 contain general information that should be helpful to those that need to get the information quickly.
- Sections 9 through 11 and 16 contain other technical and scientific information.
- Sections 12 through 15 are provided to be consistent with the UN Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labeling of Chemicals

WHEN TO USE AN SDS

Always be familiar with the hazards of a product before you start using it. You should look at an SDS, match the name of the product on the container to the one on the SDS, know the hazards, understand safe handling and storage instructions, as well as understand what to do in an emergency.

4 MAIN PURPOSES

Think of the SDS as having four main purposes.

- **IDENTIFICATION:** For the product and supplier
- HAZARDS: Physical (fire and reactivity) and health
- PREVENTION: Steps you can take to work safely, reduce or prevent exposure, or in an emergency
- **RESPONSE:** Appropriate responses in various situations (e.g., first-aid, fire, accidental release)

If an emergency occurs and you need to seek medical attention, take the job site handbook with you.


AT A MINIMUM
