The Covid-19 pandemic is not over yet, as much as we ALL would like it to be.





Spring Cleaning and Trash Removal

Spring is here and with that comes spring cleaning! Please be aware of extra trash and dusting which can have an impact on your budgeted time.

Stay Organized

Staying organized is really important to what we do. It helps us stay efficient and thorough. Keeping your closet and equipment well maintained is just a small part of keeping yourself organized.

Clean your job closet

Spring is a great time to clean your job closet. Please keep closet neat, clean and organized by:

- 1. Throw away empty chemical bottles
- 2. Check laundry for old, torn towels
- Clean up floor signs and your carts
- 4. Scrub your dump sinks
- 5. Mop the floor in your closet
- 6. Do maintenance on your equipment

Trash Removal

In many accounts, they like to clean out desk drawers and rearrange their work stations during Spring. Always test to see how heavy your trash is and if too heavy, separate into different bags. It's always safer to make

extra trips to dumpster with lighter bags. Injuries can occur when lifting an unexpected heavy trash can.

- Never use your hand/s to push down trash.
 Use another trash can bottom to do this.
- Multitasking may save time with some jobs, but not when it comes to taking out the trash. Never try to hold the dumpster lid open while tossing trash inside. Open the lid first, then use both hands to deposit trash.
- Wear gloves to prevent injury from dangerous materials inside trash bags and dumpsters.
- If you find that the loads are frequently too heavy for one person to handle, consider checking the bags when they are half full to eliminate the need for two people and to avoid extra strain on your lower back.
- Bend your knees and, with your back straight, lift the load close to the body. Never lift and twist.

Cleaning Instructions

It is important to keep our cleaning routines consistent and organized. This is a good time to go over the specific cleaning instructions for your account/s and make sure you are not missing anything. We want to provide every customer with a clean, healthy, safe and productive workplace.

Routine Maintenance

In order to keep our vacuum's working properly and safely, the equipment should be maintained on a regular schedule. Inspect the vacuum, filters, extension cords, and straps. Do not use a vacuum that needs repair. Instead, contact your manager for a replacement.

Extension Cord Safety

The extension cord is used to deliver electrical energy to the vacuum. To reduce the possibility of electric shock, employees should treat the vacuum and extension cord with extreme caution.

Please use only the extension cords provided by ESS. Also, please remember to turn off the power to the vacuum before unplugging the extension cord.

Always immediately report any electrical hazards and damaged or defective equipment to your manager!
