




Better SAFE than SORRY!



Unfortunately, accidents happen. While sometimes they are out of our control, many times there are measures we can take to help prevent car accidents from happening. Whether it is limiting distractions, controlling your speed, or learning the art of defensive driving, the following tips will be sure to help you stay safe and accident free:







Stay Alert! Be aware of your surroundings -- Watch for deer, especially around dawn and between the hours of 6pm and 9pm when they're most active.

Limit Distractions – Cell phones, fumbling with the GPS, changing the music – these are all distractions that can result in a car accident. The best practice is to set the GPS and music before taking off, and consider putting your phone in the middle console while you're driving – Remember: It can wait!

Lastly – <u>Remember the Why</u>: It is easy to get in a rush hurrying from place to place - It is important to slow down and take a moment to remember <u>why</u> we want you to be safe: We want you to return home safe and sound to your loved ones!

Accident Reporting Procedures

All accidents, no matter how small, must be promptly reported to ESS management. Some accidents may be very minor and require only a band-aid. Others will be more severe and may require emergency medical treatment.

Your safety is of the highest priority. In the event of a severe injury or medical emergency, call 911 and get the medical treatment that you need. If the injury is not severe and/or you are able, you must complete the accident report form (located in the job book), notify your supervisor, and cooperate with the accident investigation that will be conducted by ESS management.

Parking Lot Safety

It's getting darker earlier in our shifts, so please always be alert to your surroundings. Trust your instincts and know where you can go for safety and how to call for help!





Be Alert! Do not wear headphones or be distracted by a cell phone conversation.



Have a sturdy flashlight to light your path, it can also be used for self-dense. Carry a whistle or other personal alarm.



Always have your car keys and building keys in your hand, ready to unlock your vehicle or building.

if you are suspicious, walk away. Go to a safe place and call for help.



The Key to Winter Weather is Preparedness!

The winter season is an important time to keep safety on your mind. During this time of year, the weather can pose many safety risks, both at home and in the work place.

Be Prepared:

local weather forecast. Know what type of environmental conditions to expect. Such as; freezing rain, sleet, snow, ice or below freezing temperatures. Having this information in advance will help you determine how to dress so that you will be comfortable and also if you need to make special arrangements for transportation.



Dressing for Cold Weather:

It is especially important to dress for cold weather conditions during the winter months. For maximum protection and comfortability, both indoors and out; dress in layers. For outerwear, select a high quality coat that has a nylon outer layer to break the wind and a wool or synthetic inner layer to provide insulation. In addition to a coat, invest in hat, gloves

and boots.

The accumulation of ice and snow on sidewalks and walk ways is common during the winter months, presenting a new hazard of slips and falls. To avoid slipping on ice, sprinkle salt (provided at every account) on sidewalks, to and from your car, and near the dumpster area. *If your account does not have ice melt – let your manager know asap!

Winter Driving Safety:

Whether you drive a company vehicle or not, please keep in mind that winter weather causes many unsafe driving conditions.

Always allow yourself extra time to get to and from work. Icy or snow covered roads and impaired visibility from blowing snow will affect the speed at which you can safely drive. And remember that it's not just about you – drive defensively and be aware of other drivers at all times. This may help you avoid an accident when another driver loses control.

Watch Out for Wet Floors:

Unfortunately, the outdoors does not always stay outside.
Pay extra attention to entrances and high traffic areas in your building during the winter months.
Patrons will bring snow and ice in on their shoes creating puddles and wet floors.

Consider placing a wet floor sign in the entryway as a caution to patrons and employees.

Avoiding Illness:

Cold weather is also a time for common illnesses such as the common cold and influenza. To safeguard against these airborne pathogens, there are a few simple rules to follow:

- Wash your hands frequently
- Avoid touching your face
- Disinfect surfaces regularly
- Boost your immune system with a healthy diet and regular exercise.
